	Physical Descriptions	Other Notes	Picture
Schubert Chokecherry	Green leaves in spring, white flowers when in bloom & purple leaves in the fall. Tree produces small non-edible berries. Grows to 25' tall with a 10'-15' spread.	Berries are not usually messy. Best grown in sunlight and does not tolerate standing water well.	
Lodgepole Pine	Tidy, native tree with dark green needles. Needles turn yellow with age. Grows to a height of 40' with a spread of 10'.	Medium growth rate and great for shelterbelts or in naturalized settings.	
Green Ash	Green leaves & no fruit or flowers. Grows in an oval upright shape. Grows up to about 60' high with a 45' spread.	Tree likes lots of water. Generally, the first tree to drop leaves and last to get leaves in the spring.	
Mountain Ash	Green leaves, white flowers when in bloom & red berries that are a bird favourite. Grows to 10'-30' high and spreads about 15'.	Sensitive to wind/elements, grows in an oval shape.	
Amur Cherry	Grows to a height of 25' with a spread of 20'. White blooms in the Spring and small black fruit with bright yellow leaves in the fall.	Bark is a unique copper/golden brown colour and it has a fast growth rate.	
Paper Birch	Grows to a height of 40' with a spread of 20'. Golden fall foliage and great for large area planting. Light brown bark turns chalk white over time.	Medium to fast growth and prefers moist soil. Needs to be well watered prior to fall freeze up.	
Spruce	A coniferous tree with dark green pine needles. Grows on average to 50' with about a 15' spread.	Tree grows in a pyramid shape with stiff, horizontal branches creating a dense canopy. Sensitive to overwatering.
